



Salmon in the Classroom

2014 Schedule

Getting kids excited and knowledgeable about their environment is the goal of the Salmon in the Classroom Program. The program is an all encompassing "web of life" field trip with kids who raise salmon eggs from the Suquamish Tribe to fry stage while learning about stream health indicators and how to improve the health of Clear Creek.



Salmon in the Classroom was started in 1987 by a local chapter of the Kiwanis Club, to help restore salmon runs to Clear Creek, while educating school children about the lifecycle of salmon.



Over the years the program thrived and became too big for the Kiwanis Club to manage. Their shoes were too big to fill so the Clear Creek Task Force partnered with Surface and Storm Water Management, Kitsap Public Utilities District, Kiwanis Club of Silverdale, Kitsap Health District, areas schools, both public and private, Air Management Systems and the Suquamish Tribe to continue the program. The program runs from September to April.

September – Welcome Back letter to the teachers to find out who is participating, check out tanks and schedule maintenance issues.

October – Contact with the Tribe and Hatchery for cycle of life field trips, tree harvesting and potting.

November – Hatchery Tours, tree harvesting and potting.

December – Reminder to teachers to setup tank before break, maintenance issues and egg pickup dates scheduled.

January – Egg pickup and Station Reconnaissance Walk, call for volunteers

February – Volunteer Training, tree harvesting

March - Field Trips
